For the academic year 2017/18, Primrose Hill will receive a Sports Premium Allocation of £18,140. This funding represents the increased allocation of £16,000 plus £10 per pupil to improve health/sport. At Primrose Hill, we will use the funding to try and achieve the following five aims:

To increase participation in competitive sport

To support the profile of PE and Sport across the school and use as a tool for whole school improvement

To increase confidence, knowledge & skills of all staff in teaching PE & Sport

To develop competence in a broad range of physical activities

To engage all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles
