Year Two

Exploring and Developing Ideas

- Record and explore ideas from first hand observations.
- Ask and answer questions about the starting points for their work.
- Further develop their ideas – try things out, change their minds.
- Explore the work of artists, craftspeople and designers from different times and cultures for differences and similarities.

Evaluating and Developing Work

- Review what they and others have done and say what they think and feel about it.
- Identify what they might change in their current work or develop in future work.

Drawing

- Experiment and refine the use of a variety of media; pencils, rubbers, crayons, pastels, felt tips, charcoal, ballpoints, chalk.
- Control the types of marks made with the range of media.

Lines and Marks

- Name, match and draw lines/marks from observations.
- Invent new lines.

Form and Shape

- Draw shapes in between objects.
- Invent new shapes.

Tone

Investigate tone by drawing light/dark lines, light/dark patterns, light/dark shapes.

Painting

- Mix and match colours to artefacts and objects.
 - Experiment with tools and techniques e.g. layering, mixing media, scraping through.
 - Name different types of paint and their properties.
- Colour**
- Confidently Identify primary and secondary colours by name.
 - Mix primary shades and tones.

Texture

- Create textured paint by adding sand, plaster.

3-D

- Manipulate malleable materials in a variety of ways including rolling and kneading.
- Explore sculpture with a range of malleable media.
- Manipulate malleable materials for a purpose, e.g. pot, tile.
- Understand the safety and basic care of materials and tools.

Form

- Experiment with constructing and joining recycled, natural and manmade materials.
- Use simple 2-D shapes to create a 3-D form.

Texture

- Change the surface of a malleable material e.g. build a textured tile.

Textiles and Collage

- Match and sort fabrics and threads for colour, texture, length, size and shape.
- Change and modify threads and fabrics, knotting, fraying, fringing, pulling threads, twisting, plaiting.
- Cut and shape fabric using scissors/snips.
- Apply shapes with glue or by stitching.
- Apply decoration using beads, buttons, feathers etc.
- Create cords and plaits for decoration.

Colour

- Apply colour with printing, dipping, fabric crayons.
- Create and use dyes i.e. onion skins, tea, coffee.
- Collect, sort, name match colours appropriate for an image.

Texture

- Create fabrics by weaving materials i.e. grass through twigs.
- Create images from a variety of media e.g. photocopies material, fabric, crepe paper, magazines etc.
- Arrange and glue materials to different backgrounds.
- Sort and group materials for different purposes e.g. colour texture.
- Fold, crumple, tear and overlap papers.
- Work on different scales.
- Create and arrange shapes appropriately.
- Create, select and use textured paper for an image.
